Sermon Notes

Titus 3:7b "Adoption & Heirs" A Sermon Series on Titus June 2, 2024

Introduction

- 1) Adoption is beautiful biblical doctrine.
 - a) That God adopts us, makes us royal sons and daughters, heirs of His Kingdom, through His only begotten Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.
 - b) The idea that someone would not only show kindness to a stranger but would take them in, love them, raise them as their own, declare them their heir of all that they have, is very beautiful.
 - c) Let alone when God adopts one of us rebel sinners.

- 2) We clearly read this in our sermon text today: "so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life." Titus 3:7
 - a) An "heir" is simply the "one who gets the inheritance."

Mark 12:7

- b) Normally, one's child is one's heir.

 And receiving one's full inheritance is a blessing.
- 3) The Bible teaches we are heirs¹ because we have been adopted and will receive an inheritance.²
 - a) Ephesians 1:5 "He predestined us to <u>adoption</u> as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will,"
 - b) Galatians 4:5-7 "so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the <u>adoption</u> as sons. Because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' Therefore you are no longer a slave, but a son; and if a son, then an heir through God."

The Problem - Child of Satan

- 1) We are going through Titus 3:3-8, which is one of the most beautiful and shortest, yet profound, Gospel texts in the Bible.
 - a) Along with Ephesians 2:1-10, Titus 3:3-8 is one of the best texts to witness with.
 - b) It follows the classic pattern of:
 - i) First, you have to understand the problem Sin.

Titus 3:3

ii) Next, to know the solution - **Salvation is only through Chris**t.

Titus 3:4-7

iii) Finally, the outcome of such a salvation - **Good works**.

Titus 3:8

- c) The order is critical!³
 - i) You can't skip steps!
 - ii) If you water down the problem you will not get the solution and the liberation it brings.
 - iii) This is very easy to do, however. Let me illustrate...

As the Heidelberg Catechism, Q#2, puts it: Question: What must you know to live and die in the joy of this comfort?

Answer: Three things: First, how great my sin and misery are; (Rom 3:9-10; 1John 1:10) Second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery; (2John 17:3; Acts 4:12; 10:43) Third, how I am to thank God for such deliverance. (Matt 5:16; Rom 6:13; Eph 5:8-10; 2Tim2:15; 1Pet 2:9-10)

- 2) *Question*: Do you believe that everyone is a child of God?⁴
 - a) This is what Disney told us in the 1996 movie "Hunchback of Notre Dame" when Esmeralda sings "*I thought we all were the children of God*".
 - Radhanath Swami, the American Hindu Gaudiya Vaishnava guru, community-builder, activist, and author writes, "Everyone is a child of god. God loves all of his children."
 Probably the majority of professing Christians in the USA would agree with this.
 - c) If you believe everyone is a child of God then you directly contradict Titus 3:7, the biblical doctrine of Adoption (which we just heard about) and Christ Himself.
- 3) If you want to understand the good things of the Gospel, you have to understand the bad things.
 - a) Again, the more you water down the problem the more you will water down, Rom 1:18ff or even reject, the good news and live in ignorance and darkness.
 - b) If God the Father has to adopt us through His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, this means we start this life as someone else's son or daughter, right?
- 4) This is the clear teaching of Scripture.

Acts 13:9-10; James 4:4

- a) Ephesians 2:1-3 "And you were <u>dead in your trespasses and sins</u>, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the <u>sons of disobedience</u>. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were <u>by nature children of wrath</u>, even as the rest."
 - So, fallen man starts this life as: Spiritually dead in "trespasses and sins", a child of Satan⁵ ("sons of disobedience") and an enemy of God⁶ ("by nature children of wrath").
- b) In the Parable of the Tares, the Lord Jesus teaches that we are either Matt 13:37-39 "the sons of the kingdom" or "the sons of the evil one".
- c) Jesus teaches that anyone who commits sin is from their "father the devil." John 8:34,44
- d) As the Apostle John teaches: "the one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning. The Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil. No one who is born of God practices sin, because His seed abides in him; and he cannot sin, because he is born of God. By this the children of God and the children of the devil are obvious: anyone who does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor the one who does not love his brother." 1John 3:8-10
- 5) All the good stuff (new life, adoption, reconciliation with God) implies something is wrong (spiritually dead, child of Satan, enemy of God).
 - a) Romans 5:10 "For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life."
 - b) The more you get the bad part the more sweet and powerful is the work of God's Son, the reconciliation we have and the salvation Christ brings.
- 6) Titus 3:3-8 does this.

Overview of Titus 3:3-8

1) **The Problem - Sin** = Titus 3:3

Titus 3:3 - "For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another."

- 2) **The Solution Salvation in Christ =** Titus 3:4-7
 - a) Effectual Calling Solely by God's gracious undeserved kindness salvation is wrought* upon God's people.
 All of salvation is all of grace.

John 6:44-45; Acts 26:18; Eph 1:18-20; Phil 2:13; 2Thes 2:13-14; 2Tim 1:9

* Wrought = "Worked; elaborated; not rough or crude. i.e. 'wrought iron'"

b) **Regeneration** - We are given spiritual new life inside of us which causes us to turn away from sin and turn and trust in Christ.

Ezek 11:19; 36:26; John 3:3-7; 2Cor 5:17;

1Pet 1:3,23

- c) **Justification** We are legally declared innocent because Christ's righteousness is imputed/credited to us, which we receive by faith alone.⁷
- d) As we read in Titus 3:4-7a "But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared, He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace . . ."
- 3) **The Outcome Good Works =** Titus 3:8
- 4) There is one more thing before Good Works, however, we need to discuss before we finish about salvation in Titus 3:3-7.
 - a) There is another legal pronouncement that goes with *justification*, it is *adoption*.
 - b) Titus 3:7 "so that being <u>justified</u> by His grace we would be made <u>heirs</u> according to the hope of eternal life."
 - c) We are not only forensically/legally declared innocent, we are also legally adopted.

Adoption & Heirs

1) There is little talk about adoption in the Old Testament.

a) This is not surprising because God chose one people (Israel) from Eden to be His until the prophesied New Covenant.

Deut 7:6; 14:2; Heb 11:7-9

- b) Ex odus19:5-6 "Now then, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be My own possession among all the peoples, for all the earth is Mine; and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words that you shall speak to the sons of Israel."
- c) Isaiah 42:6 "I am the LORD, I have called You in righteousness, I will also hold You by the hand and watch over You, and I will appoint You as a covenant to the people, as a light to the nations,"

2) In Christ, the Gentiles are in-grafted into the OT promises, which were just shadows and figures of the clarity and reality that we now see and have in Christ.

Rom 11:17-24; Gal 3:6,29; Eph 2:11-16; Col 2:16-17; Heb 8:5; 9:23; 10:1

a) This is all by God's predetermined plan, solely by His grace.

Eph 1:5-6; James 2:5

- b) We are "a people for God's own possession." 1Peter 2:9
- c) As we read in Titus 3:4-7a, it is all by the work of God through Christ.
- 3) Being an adopted child of God, through Christ, has blessings now, and also blessings to come, i.e. an inheritance.
 - a) Just like being adopted in this world has blessings now (loving parents, a home, etc.) and blessings later (inheritance).
 - b) Unlike in this life, those who adopt a child will die, however, the One who has adopted us has conquered death.

1Cor 15:26,54-56

Adoption - Blessings in This Life

- 1) Adoption makes God our Father, not in some general sense, but in a very personal way.
 - a) As we read in 2Corinthians 6:17b-18 "'And I will welcome you. And I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to Me,' says the Lord Almighty."
 - b) We see this in the use of "Abba! Father!" in Scripture.

Mark 14:36; Rom 8:15; Gal 4:5-7

- i) "Abba" was originally a nursery word used by children when talking to their father.
- ii) It is very intimate, familiar and personal.
- iii) Probably the best literal translation would be "daddy."
- c) The Lord Jesus, the only begotten Son of God, of course uses it.

Mark 14:36

- d) Because of Christ's work, now that we are children of God, we can use it too.
 - i) Galatians 4:4-7 "But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the <u>adoption as sons</u>. Because you are <u>sons</u>, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'

 Therefore you are no longer a slave, but a <u>son</u>; and if a <u>son</u>, then an <u>heir</u> through God."
 - ii) Romans 8:15-17 "For you have not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have received a spirit of <u>adoption as sons</u> by which we cry out, 'Abba! Father!' The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are <u>children of God</u>, and if <u>children</u>, <u>heirs</u> also, <u>heirs</u> of God and fellow <u>heirs</u> with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him."
- 2) Adoption has put us into Christ's Kingdom, and we are citizens of His heavenly Kingdom right now.

Luke 12:32; Eph 2:19; James 2:5; Phil 1:27; 3:20; Heb 12:22,28; Col 1:13; 3:1; 4:11;

a) Whereas Israel inherited the land of Canaan, the church will "inherit the earth." Matt 5:5

b) Christ's current spiritual Kingdom has been advancing for 2,000 years!

Luke 24:47

- a) Including having new life in the Spirit, regenerated, justified and adopted right now!
- b) 1Peter 1:3-5 "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to obtain an inheritance which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."
 - i) Note where this begins: Worship & doxology. How can we not be thankful for such blessings!
 - ii) The things we *have* received:
 - * Born again,
 - * Have a living hope (on-going and powerful unlike worldly hope),
 - * Protected by the power of God (which is shown by the faith He has given us).
 - c) Acts 26:18 "to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me."
 - c) Also, our salvation is also ongoing. We are being sanctified and being prepared for the glories of heaven.

Phil 2:12 Heb 5:9

4) We have hope - Full assurance of what we have now and what we will have.

Rom 4:21; Col 2:2; Heb 6:11; 10:22

- a) Because again, He who has adopted us already conquered death.
- b) And we can trust in His promises.
- c) Ephesians 1:18-20 (KJV) "The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places,"

Inheritance - Blessings to Come

1) Our full inheritance is to come, eternal life in heaven and then finally when all creation is redone into the new heavens and new earth.

Matt 19:29; Heb 9:15

- Titus 3:7 "so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life."
- 2) Matthew 25:34 "Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."
