

Sermon Notes

Haggai 1:1-2a "Thus Saith the Lord!" A Sermon Series on the Book of Haggai July 28, 2024

Introduction

- 1) One of the greatest offenses to the modern world is the Christian proclamation that God has spoken with clarity and objectively.
 - a) Not subjectively, based on our inner feelings. This the world might allow.
 - b) As Satan said to Eve in the garden, "*Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden?*"- Genesis 3:1b
 - c) However, God has clearly spoken objectively (facts outside of ourselves) that must be heard, believed and obeyed.
- 2) Throughout history God has spoken in various ways. As our Confession states: "Although the light of nature, and the works of creation and providence do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom, and power of God, as to leave men inexcusable; (Rom 2:14-15; 1:19-20; Ps 19:1-3; Rom 1:32; 2:1) yet they are not sufficient to give that knowledge of God, and of His will, which is necessary unto salvation. (1Cor 1:21; 2:13-14)" Savoy Declaration 1.1
 - a) This is *General* (or *Natural*) *Revelation* God speaking indirectly to us through His creation, which shows there is a Creator.
 - b) So, everyone deep down, knows that God exists, and that something is wrong (i.e. sin).
 - i) The problem isn't lack of evidence. Don't believe the atheists on this, believe God.
 - ii) The problem is the world "suppress(es) the truth in unrighteousness". Rom 1:18b
 - iii) Try this question next time you talk to an atheist: "*If I could prove to you the existence of God by your standards, would you then worship and follow Him?*"
 - Every atheist I have heard reply has said: "No I would hate God and rebel."
 - Showing the real problem.
 - c) General Revelation, however, doesn't tell us how we are to be saved (i.e. Christ's Gospel).
 - d) Basically, enough information gets through to damn us but not to save us.
- 3) We need Special Revelation God directly speaking to us. As the Confession continues: "Therefore it pleased the Lord, at sundry times, and in divers manner, to reveal Himself, and to declare that His will unto His Church; (Heb 1:1)" – Savoy Declaration 1.1
 - a) Note, the focus is God speaking to the church during the Old Covenant.
 - b) In the OT God spoke in "sundry (miscellaneous) times and in divers (various) manners."
 - c) For example:

d)

i) Before the Fall, directly to Adam & Eve in the Garden of Eden.	Gen 2:16ff	
 ii) At Mount Sinai, a rare time when God spoke to all the people, where Moses received the Law and the Ten Commandments. 	Ex 19:18ff Ex 20:3-17

e) Prophets spoke God's Word throughout the Old Testament, but especially in the later periods when Judah & Israel we governed by Jewish kings or foreign invaders.

4) As we see in today's sermon text.

Introduction Haggai

- 1) For the next few weeks, we will be going through this little (2 chapters) Book of Haggai about the prophecies God gave to the prophet Haggai to proclaim to Israel.
- 2) We are directly told in the text when this revelation was given to Haggai.
 - a) Haggai 1:1a "In the second year of Darius the king, on the first day of the sixth month"
 - b) In 586 BC the Babylonians had conquered the Southern Jewish Kingdom of Judah, destroying the Temple, and taking the people into captivity.
 - c) In 538 BC the Persians conquer the Babylonians and allow the Jews to go back home. (See the Books of Ezra & Nehemiah.)
 - d) The Jews return in different groups (538 BC under Zerubbabel, 458 BC under Ezra, the last group under Nehemiah in 432 BC.)
 - i) At first the people work to rebuild God's House, the Temple, but soon for various reasons their efforts slow and eventually give up on the task.
 - ii) God sends prophets, such as Zechariah and Haggai, commanding His people to rebuild God's House.
 - iii) Haggai, chapter 1, is set in the year 520 BC. Hag 1:1,14
 - iv) Darius is a Persian king who continues his predecessor's (Cyrus) policy of being supportive of the Jews.
 - v) Darius even assists the rebuilding by ordering it to continue and Ezra 6:1-12 subsidizes the restoration of godly worship in the Temple!
- 3) The next part of the verse describes what makes a prophet" *"the word of the LORD came by the prophet Haggai"*. Haggai 1:1b
 - a) A prophet, in the biblical sense, is someone called by God to speak God's word. Deut 18:18
 - i) It's not about the prophet's opinion or feelings.
 - ii) It is about God's special revelation.
 - iii) The prophet is just the vehicle, like a herald, to speak his Lord's words.
 - iv) As we read in Haggai 1:b-2a "*the word of the LORD came by the prophet Haggai . . . <u>saying, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts'</u>"*
 - v) The important thing is "the word of the Lord" which simply "comes by the prophet".
 - b) This is not a person free-styling their feelings and saying it is from God. (Which is what much of modern prophecy is about.)
 - c) It is God supernaturally giving His Word to the prophet to go and proclaim it.
 - d) Thus, the classic description of what a prophet does, he says: "*Thus saith the Lord!*"
- 4) There are strict rules for prophecy, as we heard in Deuteronomy 18:18-22.
 - a) In verse 19, the prophet's words are literally God's words. To ignore the prophet is to ignore God which brings dreadful consequences.
 - b) In verse 20, if a prophet's words are not in alignment with what God has already spoken then that prophet is a false prophet and should be executed.
 - c) In verse 22, if a prophecy does not come true, then that prophet is false and can be ignored.

- 5) In the Old Testament God had three special offices to make sure His Word was applied.
 - a) All three are listed in our text: **King**, **Priest** & **Prophet**.
 - b) The **king**, in this case the "good" pagan king Darius and the Jewish governor Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel.
 - i) The king's main job is to make sure God's word is enforced. Deut 16:18; 1Sam 8:11
 - ii) Kind of like the executive branch in the US government (i.e. the President).
 - c) Then Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high **priest**.

i)	The priests' main job is to minister God's word as a go-between,	Lev 1:5ff
	and intercessor, between God and His people.	Joel 2:17

- ii) The main job of the OT priests is to offer sacrifices on behalf of the people to God to remove their sin and make them right with God.
- d) Finally, there is our man Haggai, "the prophet".

i)	The prophet's main job is to proclaim God's word.	Deut 18:18
----	---	------------

- ii) To call God's people to repent and return to God's word. Jer 20:14-15 This is call "*forthtelling*".
- iii) In biblical prophecy this is usually accompanied with proclaiming Jer 20:14-15
 God's future judgment on His people.
 This is called "*foretelling*."
- e) You see these both in Haggai.
 - i) The purpose of the Book of Haggai is to command God's people to rebuild the Temple, which they have neglected. Haggai 1:2b-5. (Forthtelling)
 - ii) The Lord is going to "*destroy the power of the kingdoms of the nations*" in Haggai 2:20-23. (Foretelling)

What About the New Testament?

- 1) What about the New Testament?
- 2) In the New Covenant church, we do not have (earthly) kings or governors.
 - a) We do have elders that govern the church, as we just heard about in Titus. 1Tim 3:1-7
 b) There is clearly a much more democratic element in the New Covenant. Thus, the people are much more involved. Acts 6:2
 - c) As Congregationalists we believe the final say is with the local church.
 - i) Why?
 - ii) *Question*: Do we have priests in the New Covenant?
- 3) Yes! All (Christians) are priests!
 - a) 1Peter 2:5 "you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a <u>holy priesthood</u>, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."
 - i) 1Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen race, <u>a royal priesthood</u>, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;"
 - ii) As per Old Testament prophecy.

- b) How are we all priests?
 - i) Because we have been covered by the once for all perfect Rom 12:1 sacrifice through the ministry of the once for all perfect Heb 7:26-10:25; 13:5 High Priest! 1Pet 1:2,19
 - ii) Revelation 1:5b-6 "To Him who loves us and released us from our sins by His blood — and He has made us to be a kingdom, <u>priests to His God and Father</u>—to Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen."
 - iii) We don't have to go through earthly priests, instead our spiritual acts of worship are spiritual sacrifices already pleasing to God because they have been covered by Christ's blood!
- 4) How about prophets? Are there prophets today?
 - a) Well, that gets more complicated, and there is much debate about that.
 - b) Some, like Pentecostals and Charismatics, believe that not only prophecy is common, today but it should be the norm in the church.
 - c) Our tradition (Reformed, with much of historical Protestantism) believes prophecy has ceased.

Back to the <u>Savoy Declaration</u>, 1.1 – "afterwards (i.e. after the Old Covenant), for the better preserving and propagating of the truth, and for the more sure establishment and comfort of the Church against the corruption of the flesh, and the malice of Satan and of the world, to commit the same wholly unto writing: (Prov 22:19-21; Luke 1:3-4; Rom 15:4; Matt 4:4,7,10; Is 8:19-20) which maketh the Holy Scripture to be most necessary; (2Tim 3:15; 2Pet 1:19) those former ways of God's revealing His will unto His people being <u>now ceased</u>. (Heb 1:1-2)"

- d) Note what the Confession states:
 - i) This speaking is to God's people, it is for the Church.
 - ii) God's Special Revelation gets written down in the 66 Books of the Bible, which we go by in the New Covenant.
 - iii) Scripture is the final means of communicating God's word and is superior.
 - iv) The Old Testament ways of God speaking have "ceased".

5) Why has it ceased?

- a) Because Scripture is superior!
 - i) It is "better", "more sure" and "most necessary".
 - ii) It is more objective, clear and universal.
- b) The Lord Jesus shockingly told His Apostles during His earthly ministry: *"it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper* (the Holy Spirit) will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him to you." John 16:7b
- c) Note the proof text the Confession uses: Hebrews 1:1-2 "God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world."
 - i) The "last days" in Hebrews is not first and foremost about the world blowing up in the popular sense of the meaning of apocalypse.
 - ii) It is about with the earthly ministry of Christ, and His sending the Holy Spirit, special revelation in the narrow sense, has ceased.

- iii) You cannot add the 28th book of the New Testament.
- iv) What further revelation could there be beyond the literal Word of God taking on human flesh, speaking directly to His church, dying for our sins, and giving us the Holy Spirit?

What else do you need?

- d) So, in the narrow sense of an individual receiving special new revelation from God that has equal weight as Scripture, has now ceased.
 - i) There are no more prophets, in that narrow sense.
 - ii) Scripture is the final revelation. You cannot go beyond what is written. 1Cor 4:6
 - iii) We are commanded to submit to the Lord Jesus' handpicked lieutenants, 1John 4:6
 whose authority is now found in their writings: The New Testament. 2Pet 3:16
 - iv) Because all Scripture is God breathed and inspired. 2Tim 3:16
- e) If you see large black and red banners on Congregational Churches that declare: "God *is still speaking*" flee. That is not a church but a synagogue of Satan that hates Christ and His word.
- 6) Prophecy can also be described in a broad way, in the sense of applying Scripture.
 - a) In that sense, prophecy still exists.
 - b) That is why our Puritan forefathers called preaching "*the art of prophesying*." (See William Perkins' book of the same title.)
 - c) To look at a church, see a problem or a need, and call the congregation to act biblically is prophesying in the broad sense.
 - i) It is not adding to Scripture but proclaiming and applying Scripture.
 - ii) Example: "This church doesn't have elders & deacons, the Bible commands elders and deacons, so we need to go to an elder & deacon system, and if we obey God, He will bless us as He has promised in His word."
 - iii) Note, this type of prophecy is much needed and can be objectively checked by Scripture.
- 7) Can God speak to us in our thoughts, emotions, dreams, about something that is beyond, though not directly contradicted by, Scripture?
 - a) Maybe, but be very careful. Remember the Third Commandment about Ex 20:7 taking the Lord's Name in vain, which brings death.
 - b) Test everything by Scripture, especially your feelings. Acts 17:11; 1Thes 5:20-21; 1John 4:1
 - c) Scripture trumps all other sources of authority.
 - d) Do not seek after visions or dreams.
 - e) Instead rest in the Word, especially as you receive it in biblical preaching and the Sacraments.
 - f) If it is not directly commanded in Scripture, you are not obligated to follow it.
- 8) For example: If a pastor comes to you and says he has had a vision that God wants us to build a new church building, be concerned.
 - a) If he had said "*I think it might be wise to have a church building*" that is okay and the congregation can have that debate about that policy.

- b) Whether a church has a building or not is a freedom issue, it is not required in Scripture, and certainly not one a church should be divided over.
- c) However, that he thinks he is having visions and putting in on the same level of Scripture, that is very problematic.
- d) Be careful, to hear about "visions" is much more worldly exciting, then Matt 24:11 simply wanting to hear Scripture correctly preached in context.
- e) Because false prophets misquote Scripture.
 - i) Even Satan quoted Scripture to Christ.
 - ii) Or, if a pastor misuses the teaching about the necessity of God having a house in the Old Covenant, such as found in the Book of Haggai, and falsely makes it into prophecy about demanding a new building.

Conclusion

1) I	Prophecy, and all of Scripture, is not about the individual,	John 5:39; Luke 24:25-27
	but about Christ.	2Cor 2:2; 2Pet 1:16-21

2) The things of the Old Testament: the Temple, sacrificial offerings, priests, kings, and prophets, are all but shadows and figures that point to the reality we have now in Christ, because we have the clarity of the New Covenant revelation which is better for preserving and propagating of the truth, and for the more sure establishment and comfort of the Church against the corruption of the flesh, and the malice of Satan and of the world, by committing the same wholly unto writing; which makes the Holy Scripture to be most necessary; those former ways of God's revealing His will unto His people being now ceased.

3)	Christ's spiritual body, God's house on earth, is the church, the assembly of the saints. (Not a building).	Eph 1:22-23; 4:12 1Cor 12:27; Col 1:18,24
4)	Christ is both the perfect High Priest and brings the perfect offering of Himself, making perfect atonement for our sins. Thus, all our spiritual offerings, according to God's Word and by His Spirit, are pleasing to Him, because we are all priests.	Eph 5:2 Heb 2:17 Heb 7:24-25 Heb 9:14,28
5)	Christ is our King . As Congregationalists we believe our type of government is a monarchy. We, collectively, are to hear our King as He explains Himself in His written word, both the Old and New Testament.	Ps 110; Is 32:1-2,22 Acts 15:14-16 1Cor 15:25
6)	Christ is our Prophet . Literally God's Word incarnate. The Son explains the Father.	John 1:18; 15:15; 20:31 1Pet 1:10-12
