<u>Sermon Notes</u>

Jude 24-25 "Ages" A Sermon Series on Revelation 4-7 January 19, 2025

Introduction

- 1) Since this is the beginning of the New Year, let me ask: What *age* are we in?
 - a) The year 2025? The 21st Century?
 - b) Is it "A.D." meaning "anno Domini "in the year of the Lord" or that silly "C.E." meaning the "Common/Current Era".
 - c) Is this the modern age? The post-modern age? The Information Age (c.1970's-present)? As opposed to the Cold War Age of 1947-1991.
 - d) Are we transitioning from "Generation Alpha" (those born from 2013-2025) to "Generation Beta" (those born in 2025-2039). As opposed to the G.I. Generation (1901-27), the Silent Generation (1928-1945), Boomers (1946-1964), Gen Xers (1965-1980), Millennials (1981-1996), Generation Z (1997-2012), etc.
- 2) To classify time periods is a very modern way of thinking.
 - a) Because "modern" is usually viewed as "good" because we are supposedly progressing while "old" is "bad." (Thus the phrase, "okay Boomer" to dismiss old people.)
 - b) Of course, what is "modern" and "old" is highly subjective.
 - i) I think the "old" times were anything before 1970.
 - ii) My daughter thinks it is anything before 2015.
- 3) The Bible has a very different view of time.
- 4) We have been going through Revelation 4-7.
 - a) In particular, the 7 sealed scroll which is God's plan which can only be revealed and executed by the resurrected Christ.
 - b) I have argued seals 1-5 are about this "present age".
 - i) Seal #1 Christ, and His Gospel, going out conquering and to conquer, because He is the 1st Horseman of the Apocalypse, the one on the white horse.

Rev 6:3-8

- ii) Seals #2-4 Because of Christ, and His Gospel, the church will endure persecution by the world as represented by the 2nd, 3rd & 4th Horsemen of the Apocalypse.
- iii) Seal #5 We see the saints in heaven, especially those martyred, who cry out to God, are clothed in white and are at rest.
- 5) We are now on the 6th Seal, which I believe is about the "end of the age."
 - a) I was excited to take a deep-dive into this interesting topic so I started to ponder it during my Christmas vacation thinking I knew what I would preach on.
 - b) At first, I was going to preach a general sermon on the "Great Tribulation" Matt 24:21 and maybe the so-called "rapture" or maybe about the "antichrist" 1Thes 4:17 those popular things modern Christians think about when hearing about the "end times." 2John 7

- i) I soon realized, however, I was more and more taking my attention away from the focus of Revelation 7:1ff.
- ii) Revelation is about God's perspective, and plan, for reality.
- iii) This caused me to start to study the broad biblical concept of "ages", which became quite extensive and revelatory.
- c) Focusing on the "end times" always interest us, however, we rarely stop and ask "what does the Bible teach about the time/age we are in"?
- 6) Today, to prepare us for the 6th seal in Revelation 6, I would like to do a broad topical sermon on the biblical concept of an "age".

"Age Defined"

1) By "age" I don't mean "a unit of time" – "how old something is." (Which is "etos" in NT Greek.)

Luke 2:36,37,41-42

Matt 12:32

Rev 22:5

- 2) But an "eon" (also spelled "aeon") in English.
 - a) An "eon" is "an immeasurable or infinite space of time; eternity; a long space of time; an age." Websters, 1913.
 - b) "Eon" is literally from the NT Greek word "aiōn".
 - c) In the NT it can mean, depending on the context:

An "era – a unit of time as a particular stage of history." The "universe" / "world".
The "world system"

Heb 1:2 Luke 16:8; 1Cor 3:18; 2Cor 4:4; 1Tim 6:17; 2Tim 4:10 Luke 1:70; Jude 25

"Long ago"

"Forever, eternal, without end"

3) We see this in today's sermon text.

- a) Jude 24-25 is the closing doxology of this very short NT letter/epistle.
- b) Verse 24 reads "Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy,"
 - i) What a great doxology!
 - ii) A saying of glory (what literally "doxology" means) of the power of God to His saints.
 - iii) With the promise of mercy and power, both in this life, and the one to come.
 - We are in His presence now because we have the Holy Spirit and know the perfect peace of His Gospel right now!
 - And of course that is perfectly known in heaven and the next age. As we have been reading in Revelation 4-7.
- c) Jude concludes in verse 25 with: "to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all <u>time</u> (aiōn) and now and <u>forever</u> (aiōn, literally "to all the ages"). Amen."
 - i) Let's ponder this doxology with the focus of thinking about ages.
 - ii) First note the focus on God.
 - This is, of course, not surprising.
 - However, it is so easy for us to forget this in this fallen world.

- When we think about time, and ages, we have to always remember Who created time and is Lord of all the ages.
- Revelation is a great book to help us think correctly.
- iii) Next, notice the Triune/Trinity language in this text.
 - God the Father receives glory, majesty, and is working out His dominion and authority through His Son.
 - Not only now, but also "before all time", and "forever."
- d) To understand time, and the ages, one should not first look to Christ's 2nd Advent (Christ's future return at the end of the age) but to His 1st Advent (some 2,000 years ago starting with the Christmas).
 - i) This is, I believe, the clear focus of the New Testament, however, it is easy to miss because we get so excited about the "end times."
 - ii) The book that helps up to see the big picture from God's heavenly perspective is Revelation.
- 4) So, let us ponder the biblical concept of "ages."

"Before All Time"

- 1) As we have read in the end of Jude, there is a time "before all time".
- 2) There was a "time" before time was created, when there was only the Triune God.
- 3) Remember there are two fundamental categories of reality:
 - a) The Creator the Triune God, who has always existed.
 - b) The creation everything else which has been made by and for God.
- 4) One of the greatest lies/deceptions of the religion of secularism is the belief that the creation is the critical part and the Creator is, at best, an optional extra.

a) In reality it is the other way around: The we, and all the creation,

| are the optional part. | Ps 90:1ff; Is 40:7-8 |
|--|----------------------|
| b) God does not need the creation. He has all life unto Himself. | John 5:26 |
| Hence God's name: "I Am." | Ex 3:13-14 |

- 5) God, in His mercy, for His glory, created time which is divided up into John 9:32 periods of time the Bible calls "the ages" Heb 1:2; 11:3
 - a) Thus, God is King "of the ages".

i) That is why we sing that God is the "Rock of Ages."

- ii) Isaiah 26:4 "Trust in the LORD forever, for in GOD the LORD, we have an everlasting Rock."
- b) And all of creation, including time, was made for Christ.

i) Everything is according to God's plan, which has been "predestined before the ages". - 1Cor 2:7

- ii) And this is for His saints: "But the saints of the Highest One will receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever, for all ages to come." - Daniel 7:18
- 6) Thus "ages" and "time" is less about chronology and more about Christ.

1Cor 1:20

1Tim 1:17

Heb 1:2; 11:3

This Age - The "Ancient Time"

- 1) Though we are currently in this "age", the Bible teaches there are "ages" during this time.
- 2) Acts 3:20-21 reads "and that He (God the Father) may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you (the saints), whom heaven must receive (Christ's ascension 2,000 years ago) until the period of restoration (literally "times of restoration") of all things about which God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from <u>ancient time</u> (aiōn)."
- 3) This "ancient time" is also called "long ages (chronos) past" (Rom 16:25), "long ages (chronos) ago" (Titus 1:2), or simply "long ago (aiōn)" (Acts 15:18).
- 4) This refers to the time before Christ's 1st Advent.

a) During the times of the Old Testament prophets.

Acts 3:21; Luke 1:70

b) When mysteries of Christ were not fully clear.

Rom 16:25

c) Yet, promises of eternal life were given.

Titus 1:2

Titus 2:12

d) Before the time when people from all the nations will be brought in.

Acts 15:18

5) The change from the "ancient times" to this "present age" is Christ's first advent.

Mark 10:31; Gal 1:4;

a) Hebrews 9:26 (NASB) – "Otherwise, He would have needed to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now once at the <u>consummation of the ages</u> (aiōn) He has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself."

- b) The phrase, from the NASB, "consummation of the ages" is also translated as "culmination of the ages" (NIV), "end of the age" (RSV), "end of the ages" (NKJV) and even "end of the world" (KJV)
- c) It is literally "full completion of the ages".

This Age - Introduction

1) One of the biblical concepts for the time we live in is "this age" and the "present age."

Mark 10:30; Gal 1:4;

Titus 2:12

2) This is the age before the "age to come."

Matt 12:32; Mark 10:30; Luke 18:30;

Eph 1:21; 2:7; Heb 6:5

3) This age is also called "evil."

Luke 16:8; Rom 12:2; Gal 1:4-5; Eph 2:2

a) Clearly there is suffering in this age, including the persecution of the church. As we have heard in Revelation 6 with the 2nd, 3rd & 4th horsemen.

Rev 6:3-8

b) Satan is called the god of this age.

2Cor 4:4

c) This age is worldly and corrupt, focusing on the ways of fallen man and not the Kingdom of God.

1Cor 1:20; 2:6-8; 3:18

d) Therefore, this age is passing away.

1Cor 2:6; 1Tim 6:17

e) 1Cor 2:6-8 – "Yet we do speak wisdom among those who are mature; a wisdom, however, not of this <u>age</u> (aiōn) nor of the rulers of this age (aiōn), who are passing away; but we speak God's wisdom in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God predestined before the <u>ages</u> (aiōn) to our glory; the wisdom which none of the rulers of this <u>age</u> (aiōn) has understood; for if they had understood it they would not have crucified the Lord of glory;"

4) Thus loving, and worrying, about this passing evil age is dangerous.

Matt 13:22; Mark 4:19;

2Tim 4:10

- 5) So, should we go hide in a cave and wait for the end?
 - a) No, of course not.
 - b) We are commanded to live our lives for God, resting in Him.

Titus 2:11-14

c) Knowing that we are but pilgrims in this life.

Heb 11:13; 1Pet 1:1; 2:11

d) For our citizenship is not with this earthly kingdom but the heavenly one.

Eph 2:19; Phil 3:21;

Heb 12:22

6) Besides this age being "this present evil age", which is passing away, we are also in "the end of the age."

This Age - The End of the Age

1) With Christ's 1st Advent as the "full completion of the ages" it means we are living in the "end times", the "end of age", right now.

Heb 9:26

- a) By the "end times" the Bible doesn't necessarily mean the end of the world is only days away from 2025 AD.
- b) Though it might be, since no one knows when Christ will return.

Matt 24:36; Mark 13:32,35;

Acts 1:7; Rev 3:3

- 2) For Scripture the "end of the age" refers to the time between Christ's 1st and 2nd Advent, in other words right now.
 - a) 1Corinthians 10:11-12 "Now these things happened to them (various judgments on the OT saints) as an example, and they were written for our (NT church's) instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages (aiōn) have come. Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed that he does not fall."
 - b) 1Peter 1:20 "For He (Christ) was foreknown before the foundation of the world, but has appeared in these last times (literally "at the end of the times") for the sake of you (the saints)"
- 3) We are in the end of the age, because the final revelation of God has been given.

Heb 1:1-2

- a) What else do you need besides the Eternal Word of God becoming flesh and dying for your sins and giving you the Holy Spirit?
- b) A quick reading of the "end is near" passages¹ from the NT could cause the secular mind to think "the apostles got it wrong."
 - i) Yes, it has been two thousand years, because God is getting all His saints.

2Pet 3:7-9

- ii) And praise God it has been two thousand years for our and our prodigies' sake!
- c) Fundamentally, the final end is near because we are in the end game now.
- 4) The "final invasion" has begun.

1John 2:8

a) Remember, the 1st Horseman of Revelation 6 is Christ.

Rev 6:1-2

- b) He, and His Gospel, are right now going out "conquering and to conquer." Rev 6:2b
- c) The things hidden and obscure in the "ancient times" are now clear to the saints.
- d) In Christ we "have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the <u>age</u> (aiōn) to come," Hebrews 6:5b

Rom 13:11-12; Phil 4:5; Heb 10:25,37; James 5:8; 1Pet 4:7; 1John 2:18; Rev 1:3; 3:11; 22:7,10,12,20.

- e) To give a worldly analogy: It is like Operation Overlord, in June 1944, to invade and liberate Europe from the Nazis.
 - i) Yes, there was almost another year of hard fighting, which in warfare, I would think, would seem like a long time for those in it.
 - ii) However, for the West, it was clearly the beginning of the end for the Nazis.
 - iii) When you look at the war from the big picture, there is no way the Axis can win World War 2 in 1944.

This Age - The "Very" End of the Age

- 1) But doesn't the Bible speak about an "end of the age" at the VERY "end of the age"?
 - a) Aren't there prophesies about the Great Tribulation, the rapture, the coming of the antichrist, and how bad it will get at the VERY end?

Matt 13:39-40,49; **24:3ff**; 28:20; 1Thes 4:17; 2Thes 2:3 1John 2:18,22; 4:3; 2John 7

- i) Yes, the Bible does speak about a Great Tribulation at the end of the age.
- ii) Not so much about a rapture.
- iii) And the focus of the antichrists (note the plural) is already here, though there is the "man of lawlessness."
- b) We will be dealing with this very end next week, as we start to work through the 6th seal in Revelation 6:12ff.
- 2) However, Pastor Doug believes the Bible puts more of an emphasis on the dramatic power of Christ's 1st Advent.
 - a) Yes, there is travail for the church in this age.
 - i) Remember the 2nd, 3rd & 4th horsemen.
 - ii) Those in Christ have received much but will be persecuted.

Mark 10:29-30; Luke 18:30

- b) Yet Revelation was written to encourage the saints to faithfulness.
 - i) To show us that history is unfolding according to God's plan (e.g. the seven sealed scroll) and only the Lamb, once slain, Jesus Christ, can reveal and execute it.
 - ii) Thus we remain faithful knowing this end is but passing away.
- 3) Yes, we have questions about the "end times", however, do not miss the power we have now.
 - a) Acts 1:7-8 "He (Christ) said to them (His Apostles/church), 'It is not for you to know times or epochs which the Father has fixed by His own authority; but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."
- 4) We think history is centered around mankind.
 - a) It is not Praise God!
 - b) It is centered around Christ Praise God!!
 - c) Yes we live in this "present evil age".
 - d) However, we have Christ! And the invasion of the Gospel is underway.
 - e) Remember Christ's promise at the end of Matthew: "and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20b
